

**These are the MYS concert dress requirements for 2011-2012.
This information was also given out at the auditions in August.**

Boys & Girls: ALL concert clothing, *including shoes*, should be relatively plain.

Jewelry and other accessories should be neutral/not showy. Sequins, sparkles, shiny buckles, bright colors, or anything that might otherwise be a distraction while on stage is not allowed. This includes anything worn in the hair.

In order to avoid any confusion, here are the requirements for MYS concert dress. **These are REQUIRED!** MYS has a very strict dress code for concerts. If a member is not wearing proper "concert dress" s/he will NOT be allowed on stage at the concert! There will be a concert dress check at the rehearsal on October 20th. ALL members (*including* returning members) are REQUIRED to wear their entire concert outfit (this does include socks and belts!). They may change clothes* (at break only) after they have been checked by their rehearsal aide.

*** However, because of a performance at Dobson, we will NOT have access to the hall restrooms or dressing rooms. You should plan on wearing your outfit the ENTIRE rehearsal.**

BOYS must have:


- *Black dress pants/slacks - must touch foot, no jeans!
- *White (not off-white), long sleeved, collared, button-down dress shirt - must tuck into pants
- *Black bow tie
- *Black belt
- *Black socks - calf length or higher
- *Black dress shoes - no tennis shoes

GIRLS must have:

- *Black skirt - must touch top of foot, no slits **OR** *Black dress pants - must touch foot, no jeans or leggings!
- *White (not off-white), long sleeved (to wrist), collared, button-down blouse - must tuck into pants/skirt
- *Black socks (calf length or higher) **OR** tights (opaque, not sheer)
- *Black dress shoes - must completely enclose foot - no open toe, back or side



These skirt lengths are ok because they touch the foot.



These skirts are *too short*, not ok. They do not touch the foot. If you're not sure if the skirt is long enough, it probably isn't.
