While many of our members are from the Mesa, Gilbert, Chandler, Tempe, and Scottsdale suburbs, some come from as far away as Anthem, Paradise Valley, Apache Junction, Florence, San Tan Valley, and Maricopa.

ENSEMBLES AND PROGRAMS

Division 1

The Metropolitan Youth Symphony Division 1 is the only ensemble in the program that is a Full Symphony orchestra, comprised of the most advanced musicians and performing standard repertoire as well as music from contemporary composers. As a part of their required commitments, this ensemble attends an overnight intense rehearsal retreat in September, in Prescott at the PineRock Camp. Members of Division 1 may participate in the Member Recital Series, as well as compete in the Solo Competition in May.

Divisions 2, 3, and 4 String Orchestras

These are our strings-only auditioned divisions. Members are placed in the appropriate ensemble according to their audition in the Fall.

Debut String Orchestra

This is the only MYS ensemble that does not require an audition; however, a school/private music teacher recommendation and application/fee are required in order to participate. These forms will be sent home after the first rehearsal. These young musicians should have a basic understanding of the notes on the D and A strings.

Symphonic Wind Ensemble

Comprised of all woodwind, brass, and percussion instrumentalists, the literature is designed to propel all of the members forward as many will soon audition into even more exposed roles in Division 1.

Honors Quartets

Selected Division 1 members may be invited to participate in a yearlong, intensive quartet coaching experience. These members may perform as invited, as well as lobby performances at all MYS Mesa Arts Center Concerts.

Jazz Lab

Division 1, 2 and 3 members may register to participate in a yearlong, beginning jazz coaching experience. These members may perform as invited, as well as lobby performances at all MYS Mesa Arts Center Concerts. This will be our first **full** year with this enrichment program!

TUITION AND PAYMENTS (Due at first rehearsal)

Participation in the Metropolitan Youth Symphony is a season-long commitment (Sept-May). Non-refundable tuition for each ensemble for the full season should be paid at the first rehearsal.

Financial Aide Service Scholarships for registration fees. Private lessons are available on a limited basis. Please contact us at office@azmys.org or call 480-456-9501. In order to be considered for financial assistance, all scholarship *applications* must be completed by the first rehearsal.

PARTICIPATION AND ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

All public, parochial, private, and homeschool students are eligible to participate in the Metropolitan Youth Symphony program. Members are required to participate in their school's instrumental music program, if available. MYS is not a substitute for the school music experience. Dismissal or suspension from any public or private school music program will be viewed as a failure to adhere to this requirement and will result in dismissal from MYS.

Acceptance of your placement in MYS is a season-long commitment (September-May). All rehearsals and performances are mandatory including the Division 1 Retreat (See Attendance Policy for clarification and excused absences). All tuition paid is non-refundable.

AUDITIONS, SEATING, and SECTIONALS

Formal auditions are held each August for the upcoming season. Members must prepare materials as requested. Audition requirements can be found on the website www.azmys.org

Generally, the auditions require a prepared solo (no accompaniment), or a prepared excerpt/etude; scales (no minor scales); and sight-reading. All members audition live for a judge or panel comprised of conductors, or other professional musicians from the valley.

String Chair Auditions

Chair auditions are held to determine seating order for ensemble members. They are held once during each regular concert cycle. This audition is only on music in your folder as specified by your Conductor. Any ensemble member who misses chair auditions will be placed at the end of the section. In the case of anticipated absences on these chair audition dates (excused absences – e.g., school concert) you must record your audition at the rehearsal the week PRIOR to the chair auditions. First notification of the absence must be given to your Rehearsal Aide and submitted online two weeks *prior* to chair auditions.

Under no circumstances will you be allowed to audition at a later date.

Results of the auditions will be distributed for all ensembles at the same time, via email, prior to the following rehearsal. At the conductor's discretion, musicians who are unable to fulfill the attendance requirements, unable to play their part, inattentive, or show evidence of inadequate home practice are subject to reseating.

Winds/Brass/Percussion Chair Auditions

Initial chair placement for woodwind, brass, and percussion players will be determined by the Fall Audition scores. Chair auditions will be scheduled prior to each upcoming concert to decide seating for the next concert. Periodic music checks will also be done by the

Winds/Percussion Coach, Division 1 Conductor, and Wind Ensemble Conductor to ensure that the material is being prepared and performed at the appropriate level. Percussion parts will be assigned by the Winds/Percussion Coach and Wind Ensemble Conductor based on the member's ability to cover the part.

Woodwind/Brass/Percussion Sectionals

All Woodwinds/Brass/Percussion members will participate in sectional rehearsals throughout the season. These will occur at our regular rehearsal venue and at the Division 1 Retreat. Additional sectionals will be added if necessary. Sectional coaches are members of local symphonies and/or school instrumental music teachers.

ATTENDANCE POLICY AND REHEARSAL AIDES

Season-long membership in MYS is both a privilege and a responsibility. Regular attendance by all musicians is extremely important to the educational experience and a quality performance. Attendance at all scheduled rehearsals, dress rehearsals, and concerts is mandatory. Conflicts with school music activities and religious commitments will be excused if we are notified at least **one week** in advance. School music activities, religious commitments, and illness/family emergencies are the **ONLY** excused absences*

An absence can be excused if it is for one of the following reasons:

- A school music program event or concert reported at least **One week prior** to the absence.
- A religious holiday or other observance reported at least **ONE week prior** to the absence.
- An emergency situation or illness that is reported in a timely manner.

**We understand that school music events are a top priority for our students. These planned absences require a completed Online Absence Form. We recommend completing these forms as soon as possible when the family becomes aware of such conflicts. We also understand that school schedules can suddenly change. Please make every effort to contact the Rehearsal Aide IMMEDIATELY if this will affect a rehearsal. While we respect that many additional extracurricular opportunities are available for students, they are not considered as excused absences from our rehearsals and concerts.*

Rehearsal Aide and Absences

Each ensemble has a Rehearsal Aide who functions as an individual ensemble manager. S/he is your **primary point of contact for all questions and absences**. Put your Rehearsal Aide's phone number in your cell phone. You will receive this by the second rehearsal at the latest.

WHAT TO BRING TO REHEARSAL

1. Your instrument and all necessary accessories such as mutes, rockstops, mouthpieces, and percussion mallets.
2. A music stand - it's time for you to have a good quality stand
3. A pencil with eraser. All music has been loaned to you and must be returned in the manner in which it was received.
4. ALL OF YOUR MUSIC. Do not rely on your stand partner to be at every rehearsal. Keep your music in the provided folder labeled with your name. If you are missing music, please let your Rehearsal Aide know.
5. Emergency repair items such as extra strings or reeds.
6. Remove hats and sunglasses and refrain from carrying on side conversations.
7. A snack and bottled water for consumption during breaks. Food, gum, and beverages may not be consumed in the rehearsal rooms as per our facility agreement.
8. A positive attitude and excitement to be part of a select group of young musicians. MYS exists to serve our members and in turn we ask our members to come prepared and ready to learn.

MUSIC / FOLDERS / TUNERS

The purchase of music is a large part of the operating budget of MYS. Proper care of music is the responsibility of every ensemble member. Any member who loses or damages music will be charged a \$6 fee for the replacement of each piece of music.

Division 1 members are issued a black leather music folder. Division 1 Woodwind, Brass, and Percussion members may also be issued tuners/clips. These are the property of MYS and all members will be charged \$40 for folders, \$6 for damaged music, \$15 for tuners, and \$10 for tuner clips that are lost, damaged, or not returned.

INSTRUMENTS

Please remember that while colorful instruments, bow hair, shoulder rests, mouthpieces, etc. may be fine for rehearsals, they are NOT appropriate for ensemble performances.

INSTRUMENT LIABILITY POLICY

Metropolitan Youth Symphony, Inc. does not carry insurance on musical instruments. Members should have their own insurance coverage against damage and/or theft.

CONCERT INFORMATION

Concert dress requirements are the same for all members and ensembles. These requirements are in full detail at the back of the handbook, as well as on our Participants Information page on the website. Concert attire is *not* required at Dress Rehearsals.

Concert Etiquette: Mesa Arts Center concerts will begin at 6:30pm and have a short intermission. In the spirit of mutual support and musical development, all MYS members are required to remain in attendance throughout the performances of all ensembles. Leaving performances early may constitute an unexcused absence and may result in loss of chair seating or dismissal from MYS. If you have questions or concerns, please call the MYS office at 480-456-9501 two weeks prior to the concert date. *MYS Members*: **NO** electronic devices are to be used during concerts.

MESA ARTS CENTER CONCERT TICKETS

Tickets for the 3 Mesa Arts Center concerts can **ONLY** be purchased through the Mesa Arts Center Box office.

Please be aware of 3rd party sites that charge extremely high ticket costs. Purchase MYS tickets from the Mesa Arts Center Box office - online or in person.

DRESS REHEARSAL INFORMATION

All information regarding Dress Rehearsal Procedures will be passed out 2 weeks prior to the Dress Rehearsal.

SOLO RECITAL SERIES - MYS Hall (49 W. 1st Street, Mesa 85201)

The optional Solo Recital Series provides our members, with the exception of Debut, the opportunity to perform as a soloist in a formal recital setting. Participation is optional. Participation is free. Family and friends are encouraged to attend these formal recitals and the reception that follows.

In order to participate in the May Solo Scholarship Competition:

- Members of Division 1 and 2 are required to *PERFORM* in one of the recitals above and have no unexcused absences.
- Members of Wind Ensemble, and Division 3 may *PERFORM OR ATTEND* one of the recitals and have no unexcused absences.

Recital information will be given out at rehearsal. At that time your child will be able to sign up for a recital date. Final recital packets will be distributed approximately one month prior to your chosen recital date.

NOTE: All solos written with piano accompaniment must be performed with accompaniment. It is your responsibility to find a qualified accompanist. A list of accompanists that you can call will be attached to your application if you do not have your own. No recorded piano accompaniment will be allowed.

SOLO COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS

The optional May Scholarship Competition awarded many scholarships to musicians at the close of our past season. The number of scholarships awarded and the amount of each scholarship will be determined by the Board of Directors based on available funds.

To qualify for the MYS Scholarship Competition, members must meet the following criteria:

Division 1 and Division 2

1. Be an MYS member in good standing with all fees paid
2. Participate in one MYS solo recital
3. Have no unexcused absences from rehearsals, concerts, or sectionals
4. Apply and perform in the competition on May 9, 2026

Wind Ensemble, & Division 4 & 3

1. Be an MYS member in good standing with all fees paid
2. Attend or participate in one MYS recital
3. Have no unexcused absences from rehearsals or concerts
4. Apply for participation and submit the additional form that you will be given in March to the Scholarship Committee outlining your contribution to your ensemble. The committee will review all forms and determine the scholarship recipients.

MYS CODE OF CONDUCT

All participants of the MYS program, both members and families, represent the organization through their behavior and actions. It is important to respect the rights and property of others. We look to each member to use common sense in avoiding situations and behavior that would put themselves or others at risk. The following expectations are required of all members and families participating in MYS.

Expectations:

1. MYS families will treat all staff, volunteers, visitors, and other members' families with respect.
2. Members will follow all verbal, posted, and written instructions given by staff and volunteers.
3. Members will turn off and put away all electronic devices during rehearsals and concerts. MYS reserves the right for staff to confiscate electronic devices that are being used improperly and return them at the end of rehearsal.
4. Members will respect and treat with care all property of MYS and its partners used during rehearsals and performances.
5. If family of an MYS member needs to remain at rehearsal, they should bring something quiet to do while in the back of the rehearsal room or lobby.
6. Any threat or act of physical harm, harassment by the family of a member, or violation of any local, state, or federal law will result in immediate removal from rehearsal or performance, expulsion from the organization without refund, and referred to appropriate authorities.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Metropolitan Youth Symphony understands the financial constraints on families and because of this, we require very little on behalf of our parents relative to other extracurricular programs. We do ask that parents/guardians sign up for two of the possible volunteer options when filling out the Online Contract; many of which are a one-time obligation. MUSIC MARATHON INFORMATION – Saturday, February 7, 2026

The most important fundraiser of the year is our annual MUSIC MARATHON. MYS musicians are given a pledge form in November and they are asked to collect pledges from family, friends, and neighbors. These supporters write checks payable to MYS. While the MYS musicians are collecting pledges, the MYS office (and parents) are collecting prizes to be given away during the marathon.

Each MYS family is expected to collect a minimum of \$200.

At the Marathon, we give musicians raffle tickets based on the amount of pledges received. While volunteers are busy organizing the tickets for drawings, members from all ensembles are sight-reading music as one huge orchestra, and the Conductors are taking turns with the baton. Members get to see the light-hearted side of our directors, enjoy some laughs, and take a few breaks for snacks. Drawings for prizes will be held every half hour during the activities. The number of prizes given away each hour will depend on the number of prizes donated. You must be present to win. For money turned in on or before February 7, you will receive one ticket for every \$10 collected. Each MYS member who participates in the day's activities will automatically receive 2 tickets.

Anyone who collects \$200 or more in pledges will be placed in a special prize drawing. You do NOT have to be present to win this prize!!

A GRAND PRIZE is given to the musician who raises the most money. They can be from any ensemble. The next 3 top money collectors will receive a FIRST PLACE PRIZE. These prizes are in addition to the tickets they receive for the raffle drawings.

Concert Dress requirements:

- Black skirt - must touch top of foot, no slits
OR
- Black dress pants - must touch foot, **NO**: jeans, skinny pants, capris/ankle pants, leggings, or jeggings
- White (not off-white), long sleeved (to wrist), collared, button-down blouse, not sheer, must tuck into pants/skirt, and be pressed
- Black socks (calf length or higher) **OR** tights (opaque, not sheer)
- Black dress shoes - must completely enclose foot - **NO**: open toe, open back, or open side

ALL concert dress clothing, including shoes, should be PLAIN!
